



ESTONIAN BMX RACING CUP 2026 TECHNICAL GUIDE

The lead organiser of the Estonian BMX Racing Cup 2026 is BMX Tallinn Cycling Club, with TBF BMX Cycling Club and Sports Club Velo as co-organisers. The series is organised in cooperation with Finnish BMX clubs and the Estonian Cyclists' Union (ECU).

The Cup consists of nine rounds held in Estonia, with Challenge category riders also having the opportunity to earn points at selected rounds of the Finnish BMX Racing Cup series.

The competition is open to BMX riders from all countries. Due to Russia's military aggression against Ukraine, riders representing Russia and Belarus are not permitted to participate in the Estonian BMX Racing Cup. The exception applies to Russian and Belarusian riders legally residing in Estonia with a valid residence permit.

All riders participating in the Estonian BMX Racing Cup must hold a valid UCI licence.

All Estonian BMX Racing Cup rounds are classified as ECU Category 1 events.

1. ORGANISATION

The Estonian BMX Racing Cup is organised in accordance with the Estonian Cyclists' Union competition regulations, the UCI BMX Racing Regulations, the principles of fair play, the rules set out in this Technical Guide and any additional instructions issued by the event organiser.

Participation in the Estonian BMX Racing Cup requires a valid rider licence from the age of five onwards. All riders must also hold valid health insurance.

All riders participate at their own risk and are responsible for any consequences caused by their own actions. Riders must be aware of the risks and potential dangers associated with BMX racing competition.

Riders are required to compete in the official club race jersey registered with their national federation. Licensed riders not affiliated with a club must compete in neutral racewear (ECU Competition Regulations, clause 4.1).

2. COMPETITION CALENDAR

The Estonian BMX Racing Cup 2026 is organised in cooperation with the Finnish BMX Racing Cup series, Suomi Cup.

For Challenge category riders, the Cup consists of:

- nine rounds held in Estonia; and
- the opportunity to earn additional points at Finnish BMX Racing Cup events.

In the Challenge categories, the overall standings will be based on the rider's nine best results, of which a maximum of two results may come from Finnish events.

Participation in Finnish events is not mandatory, but provides riders with an opportunity to earn additional points and improve their position in the overall standings.

Challenge category riders may earn Estonian Cup points at all Finnish Cup rounds held before the Estonian Cup Final in Uuesalu on 30 August 2026.

Pro Open and Cruiser category riders may earn Cup points only at events held in Estonia. In these categories, the Cup consists of nine rounds, with the seven best results counting towards the overall standings.

Rounds 12 & 13 in Laukaa do not count towards the Estonian BMX Racing Cup standings.

3. RACE CATEGORIES

The Estonian BMX Racing Cup 2026 includes 16 race categories.

Championship

- **Men Pro Open** (MJ/MU/ME)
- **Women Pro Open** (WJ/WU/WE)

Challenge

- **M/W 15+** (M/W15-16, M/W17+)
- **B/G 13-14**
- **B/G 11-12**
- **B/G 9-10**
- **B/G 7-8**
- **B/G 5-6**

Cruiser

- **M/W Cruiser 30+**

Each rider may compete in only one race category per race day.

Challenge category riders aged 19–59 may compete in combined competition with Pro Open riders (ECU Competition Regulations, clause 5.7).

Competition categories may be combined in accordance with the ECU Competition Regulations, the Estonian BMX Racing Regulations, and the decision of the Commissaires' Panel. Where categories are combined, results shall be calculated separately for each race category.

4. REGISTRATION

Pre-registration is required for participation in the Estonian BMX Racing Cup and must be completed in accordance with the organiser's published instructions and timetable. Registration is available via streamzsports.com/products/2026-estonian-bmx-open-cup. The organiser reserves the right to refuse late registrations.

Entry fees per round:

- Challenge and Cruiser categories: €20
- Championship category: €30

Additional registration service fees apply:

- Challenge / Cruiser: €3.95
- Championship: €4.95

Late registration fees after the official registration deadline:

- Challenge and Cruiser categories: €50
- Pro Open category: €60

By registering for an Estonian BMX Racing Cup event, the participant confirms acceptance of this Technical Guide and grants the organiser permission to use photographs and video material taken during the competition for event coverage and promotional purposes.

By registering, the participant consents to the processing of their personal data for purposes related to the organisation of the competition. The personal data processed include the participant's first name and surname, date of birth, country, gender, telephone number, email address, and club.

Personal data are processed for the following purposes:

- organisation of participant registration and competition management;
- preparation and retention of competition documentation, start lists, result protocols and overall standings;
- informing participants or club representatives about important competition-related information (e.g. timetable changes, weather conditions, or other organisational changes);
- evaluation of competition organisation quality and collection of feedback.

By registering, the participant confirms that their health condition permits participation in BMX Racing competition and that they participate entirely at their own risk.

5. COMPETITION FORMAT

Each rider must register in one of the race categories listed in this Technical Guide.

Riders will be allocated to qualification motos, and gate positions will be determined according to the principles of scrambled seeding.

In qualification and final rounds, gate choice shall be determined based on the results of the previous competition round.

Ties are resolved automatically by Sqorz in accordance with UCI regulation 6.1.041ter. Sqorz is the official timing and results system for all Estonian BMX Racing Cup rounds. Results are published live.

Where a competition category has eight or fewer riders, the final classification shall be determined over four races, with all races carrying equal weight.

B Finals shall be held where the number of riders in the respective race category allows.

The organiser and the Commissaires' Panel reserve the right to make changes to the competition format due to the number of participants, weather conditions or the technical organisation of the event.

6. ELECTRONIC TIMING

Electronic timing will be used at rounds held in Uuesalu, and all riders must use a functioning and registered transponder.

Riders may use their own transponder or rent one from the organiser. The organiser's transponder rental fee is €5 per day.

Rented transponders must be returned to the race secretary immediately after the final race. Failure to return a transponder will result in a contractual penalty of €200, payable by the rider or their club.

7. RESULTS AND OVERALL STANDINGS

Points shall be awarded to all riders participating in Estonian BMX Racing Cup events. The winner of each event receives 20 points, second place 18 points, and so on. Each rider who has participated in the qualification motos will receive at least one point. Results are calculated within each race category regardless of the number of participants in that category.

Estonian BMX Racing Cup race results and overall standings are available on the Estonian Cyclists' Union website under [results](#) within three working days after the event, and on the Sqorz overall standings platform. Start lists and race results are available at our.sqorz.com/org/bmxestonia.

In the event of equal points in the overall standings, the higher ranking shall be determined by the better placings achieved at Cup rounds. First, the number of first

places shall be compared, then second places, and so on. If the tie remains, the result of the final round shall determine the ranking.

Only riders who have participated in at least one round in Estonia will be included in the official Estonian BMX Racing Cup overall standings.

8. AWARDS

In all race categories, prizes will be awarded to the top eight riders. The total value of prizes per round is at least €300.

In addition, podium finishers in the Men's and Women's Pro Open categories shall receive prize money. The total prize fund per round is €700 net, distributed in each category as follows:

Men/Women Pro Open

1st	€175
2nd	€115
3rd	€60

In the overall Cup standings, riders finishing in 1st, 2nd and 3rd place shall be awarded trophies. BMX Tallinn will present the winner of each race category with the traditional Estonian BMX Racing Cup winner's jersey.

All riders finishing in award positions must attend the awards ceremony. Riders must wear a race kit during the awards ceremony. Clothing must be neat and presentable. Flip-flops, caps, headbands, sunglasses, or other face-covering accessories are not permitted during the ceremony (ECU Competition Regulations, clause 10.11.2).

All overall category winners are required to remain for the official group photo after the awards ceremony of the final round.

9. PROTESTS AND PENALTIES

All riders, club representatives and other persons involved in the event must comply with the regulations applicable at Estonian competitions, the principles of fair play, and the instructions of the commissaires and organisers.

Any infringements occurring during the event shall be handled by the Commissaires' Panel. Penalties shall be imposed in accordance with the UCI regulations, the Estonian Cyclists' Union Competition Regulations, the Estonian BMX Racing Regulations, the Estonian BMX Racing Cup organisational regulations, and this Technical Guide.

Rider support persons, including parents, club representatives and other persons associated with the rider who do not hold a UCI licence, may not interfere with the conduct of the competition or with the work of organisers, commissaires or coaches. Unsporting behaviour, inappropriate interference or failure to comply with instructions by support persons may result in penalties being imposed on the rider associated with them in accordance with the applicable regulations.

All situations arising during the event shall be resolved on site by the Commissaires' Panel. Decisions made by the commissaires regarding race situations are final and are not subject to protest.

Protests may only be submitted regarding a rider's officially recorded finishing order as recorded in the official results system (Estonian BMX Racing Regulations, clause B8.7.2).

A protest must be submitted in writing by the club representative registered at the team managers' meeting to the President of the Commissaires' Panel no later than 15 minutes after publication of the results on which the protest is based.

The protest shall be resolved on site by the Commissaires' Panel before the start of the next competition round or stage, and the decision made shall be final (Estonian BMX Racing Regulations, clause B8.7.3).

A €50 deposit must be paid to the race secretary when submitting a written protest. If the protest is upheld, the deposit will be returned to the person submitting the protest (ECU Competition Regulations, clause 14.4).

Any matters not covered by this Technical Guide shall be resolved by the organiser and the Commissaires' Panel in accordance with the applicable regulations and the circumstances of the matter.

10. OTHER INFORMATION

- Estonian BMX Racing Cup riders are committed to clean and fair sport. UCI and Estonian anti-doping rules apply in full at the event, and the Estonian Anti-Doping and Sports Ethics Foundation, as well as other anti-doping organisations, have the right to conduct doping controls among all participants. Riders are required to comply with the principles of fair play, anti-manipulation of sports competitions, and sports safety regulations.
- Registration cannot be cancelled regardless of the reason for non-participation, nor may a registration be transferred to another participant. Participants are kindly asked to understand that entry fees are non-refundable and cannot be transferred to future rounds, regardless of the reason for non-participation.
- Photographers and videographers wishing to take photographs or video footage from restricted competition areas must obtain prior accreditation from the Event Director. High-visibility identification vests must also be worn. Photography must be carried out without flash, and accredited persons on the track must remain neutral.
- Any matters not specified in this Technical Guide shall be resolved by the organiser and the Commissaires' Panel based on the nature of the issue and the applicable regulations.
- Each team tent installer and/or owner is responsible for the safe installation of their tent. The organiser accepts no responsibility for damage caused to third parties by improperly secured tents.
